In 2021 the American Association released new competencies for undergraduates and graduate students and our accrediting body has approved those and starting 	Noted.

	<p>January 2025, we are expected to meet those competencies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are 100 domains with over 200 competencies that students have to complete over a 4-year period. • In reviewing the updated BSN completion curriculum, we found that we already meet many of these competencies at the community college level., but we have new self-care standards. • We sought feedback from students both locally and from other institutions regarding our Pathophysiology and Pharmacology courses. • In May, we met with Wyoming nurse educators to plan how to revise our curriculum to ensure we meet all the new standards. • We will revise our Pathophysiology and Pharmacology courses for RNs, transitioning from having the Pharmacy Department teach the Pharmacology course to nursing faculty. Additionally, a new leadership class will be added, and other courses will be updated to ensure a more streamlined and effective curriculum • Provost is funding faculty updates for these courses for the upcoming fall and spring semesters. • Marge mentioned that there are minimal changes to the outcomes and that the flow of the curriculum will improve.
